The whole country has been on an interesting journey with COVID19 but in this time we have learnt a lot about ourselves and our ability to adapt, cope and embrace a new way of learning. I am very thankful for our staff and students who took up this challenge during the lock down and moved into the online learning space. During level 2, we have focused solely on delivering classes. All other extra curricular activities were put on hold. With the country now at alert level 1, we will resume assemblies, chapels, sports, band practice and homework club.

GUIDANCE

As a School Counsellor here at ASDAH, we provide a range of highly professional support services and programmes that are implemented individually, and as well as in small groups. There are therapy sessions with some of the students during skills period.

We also explore any difficulties and concerns students are facing, as they are fronting many issues, which affect them and their families. We work alongside families to support our students. Home visits are going well and to see the break through and the reconnect between parents and their teenagers is a blessing. We also work closely with external agencies, to ensure families and students are able to access the resources available within our community.

As professionals, we work out from a client centred practice, using a variety of counselling methods in order to best support each client's needs and preferences. However, sometimes, we work with any model clients bring as it has an emotional element behind their own issues.

We also adhere to professional standards of The New Zealand Association of Counsellors and their Code of Ethics. This means that counselling sessions are confidential unless there is an imminent risk to safety.

We work collaboratively within our strong pastoral team to support students and our goal is to improve a student's emotional wellbeing, which in turn reduces barriers to their academic progress, and other life goals. We share a commitment to work towards a spiritually, socially, physically, healthy and emotionally safe school.

Finally yet importantly, working with our students and to witness the small change within themselves is a great blessing.





RUGBY LEAGUE






Learner Driver Licence:

The University of Auckland – Entrance requirement changes for 2021

Covid-19 has had a significant impact on New Zealand secondary school students, especially those making plans to start University. To support the future success of senior school students, we'll be changing the entry requirements to our programmes for 2021. We will broaden our entry pathways and place a stronger emphasis on student's Year 12 results. Table A and B requirements have been removed (suspended for NCEA and Cambridge International) for the 2021 academic year. A more permanent decision on A and B tables is under consideration.
